

Foreclosure History

• Within the Amani, Metcalfe Park and Washington Park neighborhoods, 49% of the vacant buildings and raze candidates were subject to a lender foreclosure action in the last 5 years.

Scope of the Challenge - Citywide

- 4,800 properties are currently subject to a lender foreclosure action
- Over 3,000 chronically vacant buildings in the City
- Over 6,400 vacant lots in the City
- DNS is aggressively monitoring vacant and foreclosed properties
- Over 50,000 inspections were done in 2012
- Over 83% of the inspected properties were in violation
- Over 500 raze orders pending in the City with a fiscal impact of over
 \$7.5 million
- Over the next three years, raze orders are expected to grow to 1,600 with a fiscal impact of over \$24 million











