FREEDOM SCHOLARSHIP ESSAY CONTEST

Students responding to this year's writing contest should analyze the concept of "freedom" and then, in an essay of 1,000 words or less: (a) analyze why it is so vital that the remembrance, history and lessons of freedom be passed to a new generation; and (b) suggest what they, as students, can do to combat and prevent prejudice, discrimination and violence in our world today.

To be eligible to enter the contest students must be:

Recent high school graduates (2009, 2010 or 2011) who attended school in the City of Milwaukee
City of Milwaukee residents (Preference will be given to residents of the 6th District)
Accepted to a two or four-year college or university (verification will be required)
Able to submit a completed application
