Dear Neighbor:

Taverns, night clubs, and other places that serve alcohol can be great members of our community that provide entertainment, relaxation, and enjoyment. They can also, however, be nuisances that can harm our shared quality of life. You have my promise that I will always work with you to first watch and then, if necessary, seek disciplinary action against troubled locations.

I, however, need your help. You have the eyes and the ears that can provide vital information to the City as it continues to regulate these places. Remember, though, that many of these establishments have legal rights and we have to provide solid evidence if it's ever necessary to try and suspend or take away their licenses.

So, first, I have attached to this e-mail a list of all the alcohol beverage establishments within the 12th Aldermanic District. Please note that I've sorted it by the date on which their licenses expire. ***This is important because if you ever want to file a complaint about one of these places, the City's License Division needs to have that complaint on the record no later than 45 days before the license expires!***

Second, please think about signing up for the City's E-Notify system here: <http://city.milwaukee.gov/enotify>. This free service provides all kinds of important information regarding City government and the services it provides. One of these is the list of licenses applied for which can let you know within days when operators apply to open up a new alcohol beverage establishment in your neighborhood.
