PPI NOT AVAILABLE FOR LRA RE-USE

2.0 Eligibility Criteria for Personal Property Items

2.1 The installation commander may initially identify items as not available for redevelopment if they meet one of the following criteria:

2.1.1. Property Required for the Operation of a Unit, Function, Component, Weapon, or Weapon System at Another Installation. This category includes property belonging to a unit or activity relocating to another installation where equivalent property does not exist. For example, a unit being transferred to another location may take with it any property it needs to function properly as soon as it arrives at its new location. That property may include any personal property, both accountable and non-accountable, that is required for continuing military operations at an installation not necessarily involved in a BRAC action. In any case, it should be economical and cost-effective to relocate the personal property to the new location.

2.1.2. Property Required for the Operation of a Unit, Function, Component, Weapon, or Weapon System at Another Installation within the Military Department or Defense Agency. This category includes all personal property, both accountable and non-accountable, that is required for continuing military operations and is economical to relocate to the new location.

2.1.3. Property Uniquely Military in Character and is likely to have No Civilian Use (other than use for its material content or as a source of commonly used components). Such property includes classified items; nuclear, biological, and chemical items, weapons and munitions; museum-owned property, military heritage property, and items of significant historic *DoD 4165.66-M, March 1, 2006* 82 value that are maintained or displayed on loan from a museum or other entity; and similar military items.

2.1.4. Property Stored at the Installation for Distribution. This category includes spare parts or stock items, such as materials or parts used in a manufacturing or repair function, but not maintenance spare parts for equipment that will be left in place.

2.1.5. Property Meets Known Requirements of an Authorized Program of another Federal Agency that would otherwise have to purchase similar items and the property has been requested in writing by the head of the agency. If the authority to acquire personal property has been delegated, a copy of the delegation must accompany the request. The requesting Federal agency must pay packing, crating, handling, and transportation charges associated with such transfers of personal property.

2.1.6. Property is Needed Elsewhere in the National Security Interest of the United States. For any personal property located on the installation, the property can be

relocated or otherwise designated as not available for redevelopment if the Secretary of the Military Department determines that it is needed in the national security interest of the United States. In exercising this authority, the Secretary of the Military Department may transfer the property to any DoD Component or other Federal agency. This authority may not be delegated below the level of an Assistant Secretary.

2.1.7. Federally Owned Archeological Collections. Installations must comply with 36 CFR 79 (Reference (ay)), which contains the definitions, standards, procedures, and guidelines to be followed by Federal agencies to preserve collections of prehistoric and historic material remains, and associated records. While the Federal government can transfer custody of collections and records to non-federal government repositories, it cannot transfer ownership. If an installation has an agreement with an off-installation repository to store or display Federal archeological collections, it must ensure that responsibility for maintaining the agreement with the repository is transferred to another military entity. A closing installation must ensure collections and records are transferred to the custody of an appropriate repository and the agreement with that repository is maintained by another military entity.

3.0 Automated Data Processing Equipment (ADPE) Inventory:

This part of the PPI is **NOT** available to the Local Redevelopment Authority (LRA) for re-use. All ADPE is essential to the 440th Airlift Wing for continuing its mission at Pope Air Force Base, North Carolina. Therefore, paragraph C6.2.4.1.2 (Property Required for the Operation of a Unit, Function, Component, Weapon, or Weapon System at Another Installation within the Military Department or Defense Agency) of the Base Redevelopment and Realignment Manual (BRRM) applies.

3.1 Base Operating Services (BOS) Contract Government Furnished Property (GFP) Inventory:

This part of the PPI is available to the LRA for re-use.

3.2 BracTRACK Inventory:

This part of the PPI is available to the LRA for re-use **EXCEPT** for those items on the attached list titled “Non-CACRL Items Not Available for Re-Use.” This list consists of items that are essential to the 440th Airlift Wing for continuing its mission at Pope Air Force Base, North Carolina. Therefore, paragraph C6.2.4.1.2 (Property Required for the Operation of a Unit, Function, Component, Weapon, or Weapon System at Another Installation within the Military Department or Defense Agency) of BRRM again applies.

3.3 Custodian Authority Custody Receipt Listing (CA-CRL) Inventory:

This part of the PPI is available to the LRA for re-use **EXCEPT** for those items on the attached list titled “CACRL Items Not Available for Re-Use.” This list consists of items that are essential to the 440th Airlift Wing for continuing its mission at Pope Air Force Base, North Carolina. Therefore, paragraph C6.2.4.1.2 (Property Required for the Operation of a Unit, Function, Component, Weapon, or Weapon System at Another Installation within the Military Department or Defense Agency) of the BRRM again applies.

3.4 Mobility Inventory Control Accountable System (MICAS) Inventory:

This part of the PPI is **NOT** available to the Local Redevelopment Authority (LRA) for re-use. All MICAS items are essential to the 440th Airlift Wing for continuing its mission at Pope Air Force Base, North Carolina or “uniquely military in character.” Therefore, both paragraph C6.2.4.1.2 (Property Required for the Operation of a Unit, Function, Component, Weapon, or Weapon System at Another Installation within the Military Department or Defense Agency) and

paragraph C6.2.4.1.3 (Property Uniquely Military in Character and is likely to have No Civilian Use) of the BRRM apply.

23.5 Tool Accountability System (TAS) Inventory:

This part of the PPI is **NOT** available to the Local Redevelopment Authority (LRA) for re-use. All TAS items are essential to the 440th Airlift Wing for continuing its mission at Pope Air Force Base, North Carolina or “uniquely military in character.” Therefore, both paragraph C6.2.4.1.2 (Property Required for the Operation of a Unit, Function, Component, Weapon, or Weapon System at Another Installation within the Military Department or Defense Agency) and paragraph C6.2.4.1.3 (Property Uniquely Military in Character and is likely to have No Civilian Use) of the BRRM again apply.

3.6 Vehicle Master List Inventory:

This part of the PPI is available to the LRA for re-use **EXCEPT** for those items that are **NOT** highlighted on the attached list titled “Vehicles Not Available for Re-Use.” The items **NOT** highlighted on this list are vehicles that are essential to the 440th Airlift Wing for continuing its mission at Pope Air Force Base, North Carolina or essential to another Department of Defense installation. Therefore, paragraph C6.2.4.1.2 (Property Required for the Operation of a Unit, Function, Component, Weapon, or Weapon System at Another Installation within the Military Department or Defense Agency) of BRRM again applies.
