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Project Overview

Phase 2 of the South Howell Avenue construction is on schedule.

While lanes of traffic on South Howell Avenue are open on both sides of the avenue - one in each direction - the lanes closest to the boulevards are closed to allow for landscaping activities. Trees are being planted and bioswales installed in the boulevards. All recent Department of Public Works' major reconstruction projects have included landscaping elements and bioswales to help remove silt and pollution from storm water runoff.

As part of the construction project, all of the curbs will be reconstructed from West Howard to West Layton avenues, and 40 pedestrian ramps will be installed.

The Tippecanoe Library is undergoing a complete renovation. The library parking lot reconstruction is almost complete and has helped to open up parking for businesses in the area.
