



WHEN SHOULD I CALL THE POLICE

Call the police immediately when you have witnessed a crime being committed or suspicious activity. Stay calm, be alert, be cautious of:

- * **STRANGERS**
- * **STRANGE VEHICLES**
- * **UNUSUAL ACTIVITY ON THE STREETS or IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD**

WHAT DO I TELL THE POLICE

The person answering the phone will be a Milwaukee Police Department Telecommunicator

If your call is an EMERGENCY, dial 9-1-1, stay on the phone and provide the following information:

- * Location of the EMERGENCY incident
- * A description of the EMERGENCY incident
- * Are weapons involved and type, if possible
- * Is emergency medical service needed
- * Number of persons involved in the EMERGENCY incident
- * Description of individual(s), vehicle(s)
- * What direction suspect(s) or vehicle(s) fled
- * Your name, address, and present location
- * Also, follow the instructions of the Telecommunicator

If your call is NON-EMERGENCY, dial 933-4444 and be prepared to do the following:

- * Provide your name, address, or phone number
- * Give a detailed request for service or information
- * Follow the instructions you are given
- * Ask the identity of the person(s) you are speaking with
- * Write down critical information

This number is for emergency use only

Examples of situations that may require you to

DIAL 9-1-1

- * All shooting incidents or the sound of gunshots
- * You are the victim of a life threatening crime
- * An unknown suspicious person(s) is illegally attempting to enter your dwelling or the dwelling of another
- * A person is in need of immediate medical assistance
- * A serious vehicular accident, explosion, chemical spill, natural disaster
- * All incidents where a person is screaming for help
- * All instances where a suspicious stranger(s) is loitering near or appears to be enticing children
- * Strange or unusual sounds or sightings that would evoke a threat to your physical safety or property
- * Unknown suspicious person(s) attempting to remove property from a residential or business location


TDD EMERGENCY 9-1-1 CALLERS

Send several random characters with your TDD after the initial answer. Your call will be transferred to a TDD terminal for a prompt response. Stay on the line until an operator responds

TDD NON-EMERGENCY CALLS ONLY
765-0100

9-1-1 CELL PHONE CALLS

All 9-1-1 cellular telephone calls are automatically routed to the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Department. If police assistance is needed, the call will be transferred to the Milwaukee Police Department. Be aware that there will be a short delay during the transfer of your call.



REMEMBER:

1. STAY ON THE PHONE
2. STAY CALM
3. DON'T SCREAM OR RAISE YOUR VOICE WHEN TALKING
4. PROVIDE GOOD DETAILS
5. FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS OF THE TELECOMMUNICATOR
