

# PLUMBER

The eligible list resulting from this examination may be used to fill similar City of Milwaukee positions.

**PURPOSE** of this position is to install, replace, repair and maintain plumbing components and plumbing systems in all of the Milwaukee Public School buildings and structures throughout the City of Milwaukee. The Milwaukee Public Schools expects Plumbers to be able to perform the functions typically associated with this trade at the journey level.

## ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Install, replace, repair and maintain plumbing equipment, fixtures and all piping of sewer and water services from the lot line to plumbing fixtures and stack terminals inside buildings.
- Service, repair and remodel storm sewers, conductors and roof terminals.
- Service and repair low pressure gas piping and kitchen gas appliances.
- Repair and maintain closet and urinal flush valves.
- Repair and maintain solenoid valves and thermostatic group shower mixers.
- Install, replace and repair swimming pool components and equipment.
- Operate and use customary power tools associated with the trade.
- Work independently and generally without assistance on plumbing projects.
- Perform other job related duties as assigned.

## CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Employees will be issued a pager or cell phone and will be expected to utilize this communication device at all times when on duty. Employees who are issued a netbook WIFI device will be expected to use this device for routine work order dispatching, completion, and communication.

*Reasonable accommodations requested by qualified individuals with disabilities will be made in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990.*

## MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

1. In compliance with State of Wisconsin Statute 145.06 (1) (a), candidates must have a valid State of Wisconsin Plumber's license at time of application and throughout employment.

2. Certification in the EPA Asbestos Abatement Training Program and confined space training within 6 months of appointment.
3. Certification in the Lead Abatement Renovator Training Program within 6 months of appointment.
4. A valid driver's license at time of appointment and throughout employment; availability of a properly insured personal vehicle in which tools and equipment can be carried from job to job (car allowance provided).
5. Must furnish basic tools of the trade.
6. Residency in the City of Milwaukee within 6 months of appointment and throughout employment.

## KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

- ❖ Knowledge, skills and abilities needed to perform the duties described above at the journey level.
- ❖ Knowledge of standard plumbing procedures and the Wisconsin State plumbing code.
- ❖ Ability to read mechanical and architectural blueprints.
- ❖ Knowledge of safe working practices.
- ❖ Skill in working with hand and power tools of the trade.
- ❖ Ability to solve complex technical problems and make sound technical judgments.
- ❖ Physical ability that allows performance of duties with or without reasonable accommodation.
- ❖ Ability to move and transfer objects 100 pounds or more.

**THE CURRENT HOURLY WAGE (MPS-FF50) IS:** \$36.18 per hour (prevailing wage)

**THE SELECTION PROCESS** will be job related and will consist of one or more of the following: education and experience evaluation; written, oral or performance tests; or other assessment methods. The Department of Employee Relations reserves the right to call only the most qualified candidates to oral and performance examinations. Oral examinations may include written exercises. Selection process component weights will be determined by further analysis of the job.

The examination will be held as soon as practical after **February 11, 2011**. Receipt of applications may be discontinued at any time after this date without prior notice. However, recruitment may continue until the needs of the City have been met. Qualified applicants will be notified by mail of the date, time and place of the examination.
