Narrative for Neighborhood Stabilization Program III (NSP 3) Proposed Budget Amendments

The City of Milwaukee received approximately \$2.6 million from the Federal government as a result of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protect Act of 2010 which was passed in part to provide emergency assistance for the redevelopment of abandoned and foreclosed homes through the **Neighborhood Stabilization Program III (NSP 3)**. At that time, the City of Milwaukee was required to submit an Amendment to its' 2010 Annual Action Plan, detailing the City's use of the NSP 3 funds. The amendment to the Action Plan was subsequently approved by the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development in 2011.

The following final NSP 3 census tracts amendment entails the following changes:

As detailed on the following page, the first amendment to the City's original submission entails an expansion to the program area, to include census tracts adjacent to the current NSP 3 neighborhoods of Sherman Park and to the Layton Boulevard West Neighborhoods. The original targeted neighborhoods were already approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The change is requested to reflect additional census tracts for the NSP 3 target neighborhood.

Citizen Participation/Public Comments

To ensure adequate and accessible citizen participation, the City of Milwaukee prepared a "draft" of the Substantial Amendment for the Neighborhood Stabilization Program III (NSP 3).

The public comment period for review of the proposed amendment was *August 27 through September 11, 2012*. CDGA notified interested persons and also published the report on the City's website.
