

# The Components of Your Tax Dollar

Your combined property tax rate increased by \$0.67 compared to last year. Tax rates increased for all units of government, except the State of Wisconsin, which remained the same as last year.

The increase in the property tax rate for most units of governments is due primarily to a decrease in assessed property values in the City. See the **Comparative Property Tax Rates** table at right for detailed tax rate information.

The total tax levy for all units of local government increased by \$2.1 million (+0.3%) compared to last year. For further tax levy information, see the reverse side of this brochure.





### The Lottery Credit and First Dollar Credit

The Lottery Credit and the First Dollar Credit will further reduce your property tax bill. This year the Lottery Credit is \$134.74 for each qualifying property. The State Constitution limits the Lottery Credit to a homeowner's primary residence. The First Dollar Tax Credit is \$79.11.


