FOCUS OF SEARCH FOR MISSING BOYS IS A CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION

The focus of the search for two missing boys is a criminal investigation, Milwaukee Police together with the Federal Bureau of Investigation announced today. Agents from the State Department of Justice Division of Criminal Investigation have joined the Task Force, and there are now hundreds of people from multiple agencies working on the investigation.

Members of a joint Milwaukee Police/FBI Task Force continue to investigate the disappearance of , 12, and Purvis Parker, 11. The boys were last seen at 3:30 p.m. on Sunday, March 19, 2006 in the 4800 block of N. 53rd Street. They told Garry Henning, Quadrevion's grandfather, they were headed to McGovern Park to play ball.

As time has passed, as the Task Force reviewed information, we determined there is an increased possibility that a criminal act has been committed. We still do not have evidence that a crime has been committed.

We know the public is anxious for information in this case and we want them to know that we must protect the integrity of the investigation by being very judicious in the release of information to the media. The public should be rest assured that, although there will be minimal information put out by the Milwaukee Police Department regarding this investigation, Task Force members are working around the clock and are aggressively pursuing all leads.

The Task Force is not eliminating any scenarios or possibilities in this case, and we ask the media to continue to feature the hotline number **1-877-628-3804**. There still are people out there who have information on this case and who have not yet come forward. The time is now.
