News conference on Wednesday to mark beginning of S. 27th Street road work

After significant delays and inconvenience for South Side residents and businesses, crews will begin pouring concrete Wednesday as part of the reconstruction of S. 27th Street from Howard Avenue to north of the Kinnickinnic River Parkway. The work was originally due to be completed last year, **Alderman Terry L. Witkowski** said, but was among a number of projects that were pushed back due to a regional concrete shortage.

“It will come as a great relief to the people who live, work and play along 27th Street to hear that the concrete shortage is over, and it looks like construction season is underway,” Alderman Witkowski said. “I have been assured that work on the project will be proceeding quickly, a block or two at a time, and that the project should be completed within eight weeks or so.”

Alderman Witkowski will highlight the start of paving work on S. 27th Street with a news conference on Wednesday morning. Officials from the Department of Public Works will also participate.
