"The City of Milwaukee is looking for individuals who are willing to dedicate themselves to a regimen that includes work experience in the field and college coursework in this positive initiative," Alderman Stamper said. "The program could very well lead to a career in city service (code enforcement) that is essential to keeping our city neighborhoods safe and vibrant. This is a program I strongly support."

Minimum requirements for the Code Enforcement Intern program curriculum consist of approximately 31 college credits in the combined fields of English, social sciences, math/computers, architecture, and code enforcement. The position carries a starting salary of more than \$26,000 per year.
