Alderman Bauman: City-wide job fair set for next week

A large-scale, city-wide job fair will be held next week in Milwaukee, offering individuals an opportunity to learn more about employment, training and services related to the transportation industry. **Alderman Robert J. Bauman** said the event will be held at North Division High School (1011 W. Center St.) on **Wednesday, March 30 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.**

Registration will begin after the doors open at 9 a.m., and attendees are encouraged to bring copies of their resume and to dress appropriately.

Alderman Bauman said interested job seekers should look into attending the event. “This event is a prime opportunity for anyone in the City of Milwaukee to interface with several potential employers at one convenient location, and there will be helpful services and discussions available as well,” he said.

The job fair is being offered by America Works, a leading national workforce development company.

Job fair attendees may meet directly with employers, share resumes and make connections for future meetings. Employers will be there to recruit for typical transportation jobs such as: drivers, equipment operators and technicians and will provide information on jobs within the industry that may be overlooked such as the call center, customer service and dispatchers.

A host of service providers will be present to help individuals during the job-hunting process. For example, vendors will be on hand to share information about: requirements to become successfully licensed and insured; getting assistance with paying fines related to driving; and programs that may assist individuals in securing a vehicle.
