Home cleaning and recycling events continue in the Garden District

The Choose to Re-Use recycling events are continuing in the Garden District this weekend, and **Alderman Terry L. Witkowski** is again inviting community members to clean out items they no longer use and donate them for use by someone else.

Tomorrow -- Saturday, June 25, from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. -- items including gardening equipment, tools, and books can be donated and recycled. The event will be in the Urban Orchard parking lot at **S. 6th St. and W. Norwich St.**, near the Garden District Farmers' Market.

Alderman Witkowski said the Choose to Re-Use events (every Saturday since June 11) have been quite popular so far. "These recycling events are like a free rummage sale, and they're a great way for residents to clean out their homes, help out their neighbors and save money by exchanging goods instead of purchasing new," he said.
