Ald. Pérez appointed to NLC 2017 Human Development Committee

Alderman José G. Pérez has been appointed to the National League of Cities (NLC) 2017 Human Development (HD) federal advocacy committee.

The committee has the lead responsibility for developing NLC federal policy positions on issues involving social services, children and learning, poverty and income support, employment and workforce development, equal opportunity, Social Security and seniors, individuals with disabilities, public health care, mental health parity and immigration reform. The appointment was announced by NLC President Matt Zone.

“Given the importance of these topics to Milwaukee residents and the uncertain political environment in Washington at this time, the Human Development federal advocacy committee’s work is as important as ever,” Alderman Pérez said. “I’m humbled and grateful for the opportunity to help shape national policy in such an important area.”
