Dear Neighbor,

As we wade through the end of snow and leaf pickup season, I continue to advocate for your priorities at City Hall. Among those priorities are continued improvements to our shared roadways. A recent City audit documented that our commitment to Vision Zero (zero traffic deaths) as a full-circle strategy to curb reckless driving and save lives is showing progress. A large part of that is the City's work to improve our roadway infrastructure. Construction season will be upon us soon, and you can keep tabs on projects underway, or soon to be, by visiting the Department of Public Works project dashboard [here](#). Among the notable projects coming our way is W. Cleveland Ave. from S. 43rd St. to S. 68th St. Traffic calming measures are planned throughout the corridor. You can also learn more about how you can advocate for traffic calming on your street via the [Community-Led Traffic Calming Program](#). The popular High Impact Paving Program will begin to hit local streets in the coming months as well. There are a lot of projects planned for 2026 and several still to be completed from 2025. Spring thaw will also bring with it a rise in potholes and streetlight electrical failures as well. Please help neighbors by reporting problems when you see them. 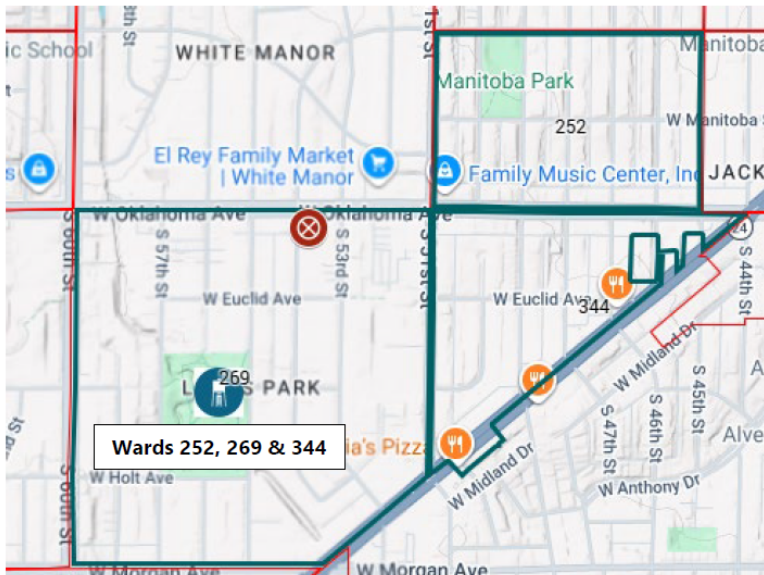
Polling Location Change

Election Day voting could not be successful without the dedication and commitment of our partners in the community, especially our public and private building owners who make special accommodations so that the Milwaukee Election Commission (MEC) can administer elections in the City of Milwaukee. Before the start of an election season, MEC conducts an audit of its polling locations. The audit reviews several factors including: Safety and Security; ADA accessibility; Voter access and walkability; Prioritizing public building where possible, as defined in state law; and Aldermanic and community support.

Given the significant symbolism and community awareness a polling location garners, MEC prefers not to change polling locations. However, sometimes it cannot be avoided due to a variety of causes, such as an emergency, change in building ownership, and/or maintenance/construction. Due to construction, MEC had to temporarily leave Lyon's Park. Now that construction is over, we can return. Additionally, the Oklahoma Ave Church location had ADA accessibility issues that will be addressed with our return to Lyon's Park. Wards 252, 269 and 344 that voted at Oklahoma Ave Church in 2025 will vote at Lyons Park, 3301 S. 55th St., in 2026.

2026 Summer Youth Internship Program

This is the 22nd year of the City of Milwaukee's Summer Youth Internship Program that put thousands of young people to work throughout various city government departments. In 2026, the Summer Youth Internship Program aims to employ approximately 100 young people in City of Milwaukee positions. This 8-week program begins June 18 and runs through August 14, with interns working 20 hours per week and earning \$16/hour. The goal of the SYIP is to provide better opportunities and a bright future for our youth; develops Milwaukee's future workforce that will build our community and local economy; and give youth the opportunity to earn some cash and learn different skills.
