The award-winning **We Got This** community beautification and improvement program, created by artist and activist **Andre Lee Ellis**, will wrap up its fifth season **tomorrow** -- **Saturday**, **August 25** -- **at N. 9**th & **W. Ring Streets** in the 6th Aldermanic District.

Tomorrow boys and young men involved in We Got This will be working in the community garden from 8 a.m. to noon, and a special closing ceremony celebration will be held from noon to 3 p.m.

Alderwoman Milele A. Coggs said she is pleased to see the continuing, positive momentum that We Got This is providing in the community. "For donors and mentors, the initiative is a great way of paying forward and helping the community by helping the boys and young men who are involved," she said. Years ago, Mr. Ellis and his wife Angela adopted an abandoned community garden next to their house at 9th and Ring, making it an informal meeting place for the community.
