## In-person early voting starts today

The start of in-person early voting in Wisconsin begins today – Tuesday, October 20<sup>th</sup>. **Common Council President Cavalier Johnson** is urging all Milwaukee residents to take advantage of this early voting opportunity to cast their ballot. Early voting will run from October 20<sup>th</sup> through November 1<sup>st</sup>, and voter registration is still available at in-person voting sites but proper proof of residence is required. Proof of residence may include: a current and valid Wisconsin Driver License or state ID; any other official identification card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body or unit; a utility bill for the period commencing no earlier than 90 days before Election Day; bank or credit card statements; and a paycheck or paystub. “We are less than two weeks away from Election Day, and I’m asking all residents to make sure you have a plan to vote, whether that is by mail, voting early in-person which starts today, or voting at your polling place on November 3<sup>rd</sup>,” Alderman Johnson said. “I was thrilled to see the turnout this morning at the Midtown Center site as Milwaukeeans lined up to cast their votes. Our democracy works best when more people are engaged and involved, and based on the early enthusiasm it’s safe to say that our residents are ready to have their voices heard.”

There are 14 early voting sites in Milwaukee this year, and polling hours differ by location. A photo ID is required to vote. The voting sites and times are as follows.
