Fast approaching: Virtual joint public hearing on 2022 city budget happening Monday, Oct. 4

Members of the public are reminded that a prime opportunity to provide comments and input on Mayor Tom Barrett's proposed 2022 City of Milwaukee budget will be provided during the **virtual Joint Public Hearing on Monday, October 4 at 6:30 p.m.**

In the coming weeks, Council members will begin to review the budget and to engage the community in the process, and **Common Council President Cavalier Johnson** and Finance and Personnel Committee Chair **Alderman Michael J. Murphy** are encouraging residents to attend the Joint Public Hearing to provide input and feedback on the on the 2022 proposed budget.

"Input from residents helps shape opinion on what is most important from the public's perspective, and is greatly appreciated by members of the Council," President Johnson said.

Alderman Murphy said: "We want to hear your concerns and suggestions pertaining to the budget, and we invite residents to utilize this forum to provide valuable feedback."

Only those who wish to speak need to register in advance and registration will close two hours before the start of the hearing. After registering, attendees will be sent a confirmation email with instructions on how to access the meeting. Speakers will be limited to two minutes each and those attending as a group are encouraged to nominate one representative to speak.
