Epsilon Kappa Omega chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. was chartered on May 11, 1949, and it is the oldest alumnae chapter in the State of Wisconsin with over 200 members. Epsilon Kappa Omega has a longstanding history of fighting for civil rights and against social injustice, and remains focused on uplifting underrepresented individuals and families.
