Subject: Public Safety Survey Data Evaluation

This memo is in response to your request for an analysis of the results of the Public Safety Survey.

At the request of President Ashanti Hamilton, the Public Safety Survey was conducted online for 42 days with a total of 1,634 unique respondents from 32 ZIP codes. The City posted the survey to gauge how the community feels about one issue or another, but otherwise there is little to no scientific basis to the results. At no time will confidence interval or sampling error percentages be generated on the results due to the acknowledged non-scientific collection means.

The Public Safety Survey was not intended to be a scientific poll. Rather, it should be considered analogous to public testimony given in committee or comments made at a town hall meeting. Further, the collection of responses is envisioned to provide general policy direction by gauging community reaction to a variety of timely and important issues. These questions were created in response to the Public Safety Committee's 2016 Special Committee meetings on crime, fear and disorder (CCFN:160155), the civil unrest during the summer of 2016, and the 2016 draft Public Safety Action Plan.

This dataset generated by the survey results was filtered for Milwaukee ZIP codes and evaluated. The subsequent graphs detail the survey results question by question.

While over 1,600 residents of Milwaukee completed the survey, a few items to note are:

- 65% of the respondents self-identified as “White (non-Latino)” while the latest demographic information shows Milwaukee to be 44% White.
- 10% of the respondents self-identified as “African American” while the latest demographic information shows Milwaukee to be 40% African American.
- 5% of the respondents self-identified as “Latino” while the latest demographic information shows Milwaukee to be 17% Latino.

Other items that may skew the results include a low rate of male respondents (42%) and a low rate of respondents aged 29 and below (11%).

Notwithstanding the aforementioned opportunities of statistical skew, the data explicated 4 noteworthy themes:



1. The 3 greatest problems in the city as reported are: carjacking, residential burglary, and reckless driving. By gender, these 3 issues do not change. By race, African Americans replace residential burglary with gun violence in their top 3. By age group, those 29 and under replace residential burglary with muggings in their top 3.
2. Overwhelmingly and in all categories, residents support adding foot and bicycle police officers in their neighborhoods.
3. 70% of residents see crime as such a large problem in their neighborhoods, they have considered moving. However, those aged 60 and above and those aged 29 and below are significantly less inclined to move.
4. The majority of respondents find the Police Department successful in solving crime, yet only 26% of respondents believe the Police Department is proactive in preventing crime.

Survey Respondents by Milwaukee ZIP Codes




