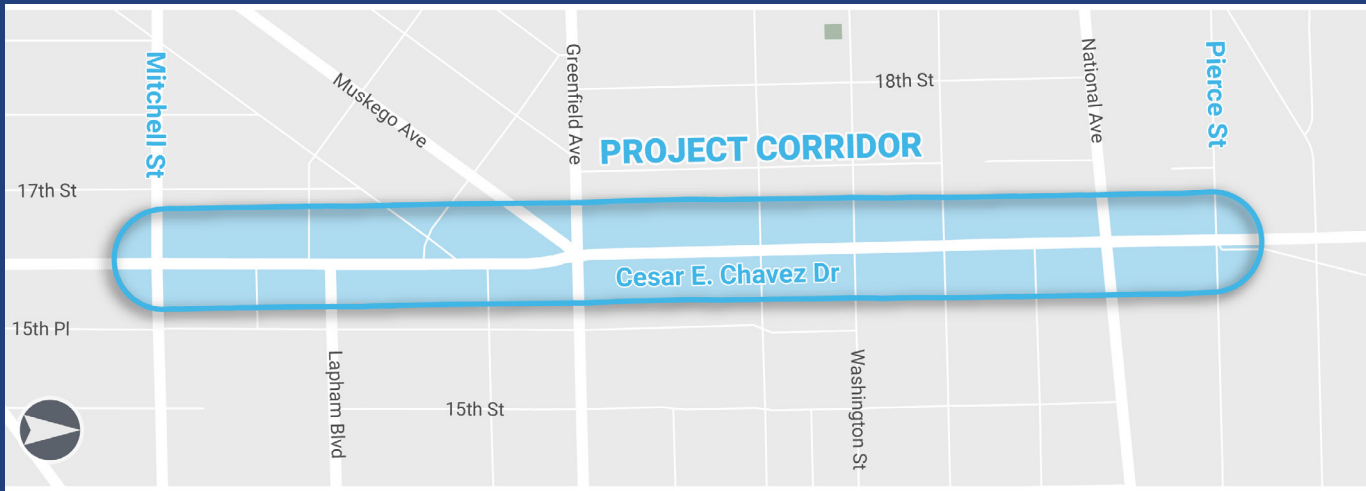




OVERVIEW

The City of Milwaukee has kicked off a Safe Routes to Transit project along Cesar Chavez Drive, from Pierce Street to Mitchell Street. This project will focus on making the street safer, more comfortable, and more accessible for people walking and taking the bus.

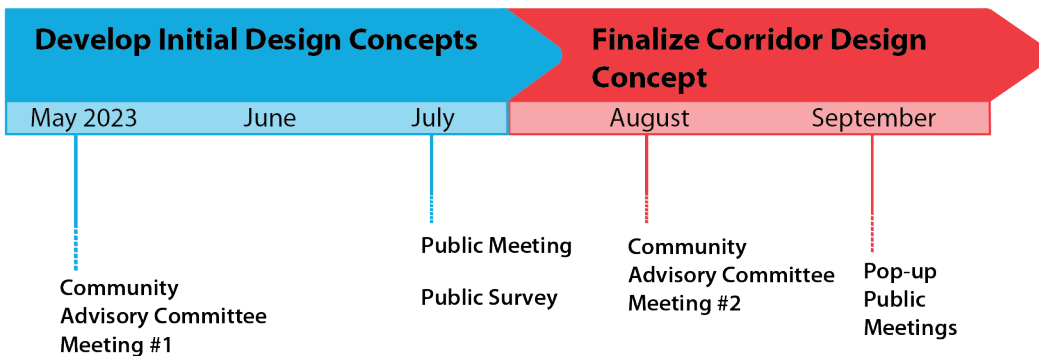


Cesar Chavez Drive is at the center of a Business Improvement District (BID) and home to many shops and community services. Although Cesar Chavez Drive is a major transit corridor with high frequency Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) Routes, the corridor is especially dangerous for pedestrians. The corridor has some of the highest rates of severe and fatal crashes involving pedestrians.

The project will improve safety through street improvements like:

- curb extensions
- bus bulbs
- bus stop relocations
- bus shelter improvements
- updated accessible ramps
- high-visibility crosswalks
- pedestrian beacons
