

**Notice of Finding of No Significant Impact on the Environment and Notice of Intent to Request
Release of Funds for the 2711 West Wells Street Project
Milwaukee, Wisconsin**

These Notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the City of Milwaukee.

Request for Release of Funds (RROF): On or about July 13, 2026, the City of Milwaukee will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to release HOME - ARP funding (M-21-MP-55-0204) - \$1,100,000 awarded to the City of Milwaukee.

Purpose: The subject properties are located at 2711 West Wells Street, 2805 West Wells Street, and 763 North 28th Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The developer proposes the adaptive reuse and historic rehabilitation of a former hospital complex into affordable housing. The project includes the renovation of a nine-story building and a five-story building to create approximately 124 affordable rental housing units. The Project will provide housing for elderly households with incomes between 30 percent and 80 percent of Area Median Income. Fourteen units will be reserved for veterans and eighteen units will be designated as supportive housing units. The project will include a mix of one-bedroom and two-bedroom units, along with related building and site improvements necessary to support the residential redevelopment.

Determination: It has been determined that such request for release of funds for this project will not constitute actions significantly affecting the quality of the natural or human environment, and that this is a finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI). Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record.

Environmental Review Record: An environmental review has been made by the City of Milwaukee. The Environmental Review Record (ERR) is on file at the address listed below and is available for public examination and copying upon request, between the hours of 8:00am and 4:45pm. Provide a 72 hour advance notice to ensure accommodation of request.

Such written comments should be received at the above address on or before July 11, 2026. All such comments so received will be considered, and the City of Milwaukee will not request the release of

Federal funds or take any administrative action on these projects prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.

Public Comment: Any individual, group, or agency disagreeing with this determination or wishing to comment on the project may submit written comments to the City of Milwaukee Department of City Development (see above for contact information). All comments received by July 11, 2026 will be considered by the City of Milwaukee prior to submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing. Following the RROF, HUD will be accepting comments for 15 days following receipt of the RROF.

Release of Funds: The City of Milwaukee certifies to HUD that Mario Higgins in his capacity as Director, CDGA, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's acceptance of the certification satisfies its responsibility under NEPA and allows City of Milwaukee to use Program funds.

Objections to Release of Funds: HUD will accept objections to its release of funds and the City of Milwaukee certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if it is on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Milwaukee; (b) the City of Milwaukee has omitted a step or failed to make a decision for finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the grant recipient has incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted via email in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to the HUD Milwaukee Field Office at MKE-ENV@hud.gov. Potential objectors should contact the HUD Milwaukee Field Office via email to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
