

The Components of Your Tax Dollar

Your 2024 City of Milwaukee Combined Property Tax Bill is based on property tax levies adopted by five local governments: the City of Milwaukee, Milwaukee Public Schools, Milwaukee County, Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District and Milwaukee Area Technical College. Your property tax bill also includes property tax credits from the State of Wisconsin: the School Levy Tax Credit, First Dollar Credit, and Lottery Credit.

Your combined property tax rate decreased by \$0.70 compared to last year. See the adjacent table titled *Comparative Property Tax Rates* for detailed information. The total tax levy for all units of local government increased by \$108.2 million (12.6%). The Lottery Credit and First Dollar Credit

The Lottery Credit and the First Dollar Credit will further reduce your property tax bill. This year the maximum Lottery Credit is \$280.24 for each qualifying property. The State Constitution limits the Lottery Credit to a homeowner's primary residence. The maximum First Dollar Tax Credit is \$87.04.

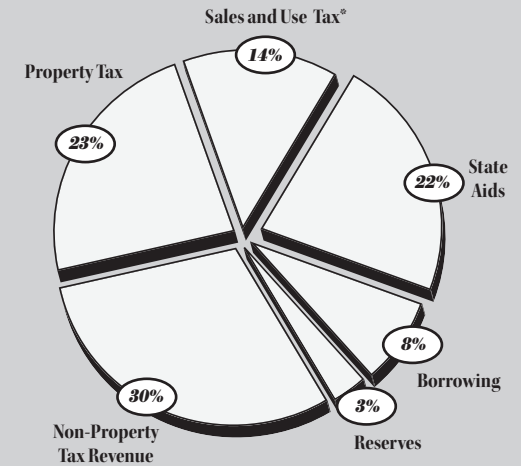

Sources of City Revenue

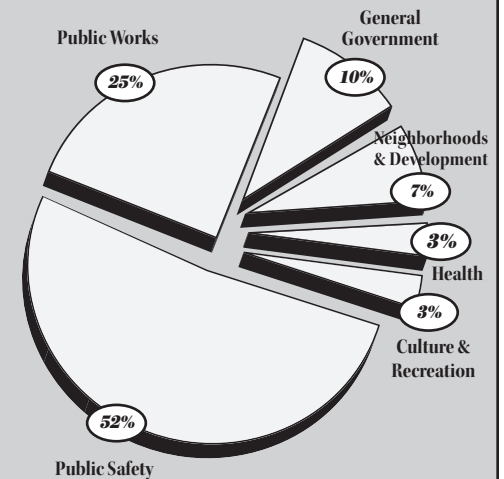
(Tax Levy Supported Budget)
