TRAFFIC ALERT

High Impact Paving Projects Scheduled for the Week of August 2-6, 2021
Each project will be completed within 2 days, weather permitting

The City of Milwaukee Department of Public Works (DPW) will conduct several high impact paving projects in the Downtown and Lower East Side during the week of August 2nd. Each project is anticipated to take 2 days to complete the work. All work is weather dependent and subject to change. The following schedule is as follows:

August 3rd and August 4th

- **North Prospect Avenue from East Mason Street to East Kilbourn Avenue**
-MCTS Route 14 and Gold will detour northbound via Van Buren, east on Kilbourn Avenue to resume regular route
- **North Prospect Avenue from East Royall Place to East Kane Place**
-MCTS Route 30 and Gold will detour northbound via west on Brady, north on Cambridge, east on Lafayette, north on Prospect

August 4th and August 5th

- **North Astor Street from East State Street to East Ogden Avenue**
-MCTS Route 14 will detour northbound via Van Buren, east on Ogden to resume regular route
- **West Wisconsin Avenue from North 2nd Street to North 3rd Street**
*Flaggers will be on-site to maintain traffic on West Wisconsin Avenue during construction
- No impacts to MCTS Route 14, 30, Gold & Blueline

All work is weather dependent and subject to change

Work includes milling (removing) the existing pavement and resurfacing the roadway with asphalt. These streets will be closed to thru traffic at 6:00 a.m. and will re-open when the work has concluded for the day. Local access to adjacent residential properties and businesses will be maintained as much as possible. Please anticipate short-term impacts to access during both milling and paving operations. On-street parking will not be allowed within the construction limits. These projects will affect MCTS bus service. Details and updates can be found at www.ridemcts.com.

DPW appreciates your patience during these projects and advises the traveling public to allow for extra time while traveling to and from these neighborhoods. These locations are among the more than 20 high impact paving projects taking place this season throughout the City.
