## **West Lloyd Street Project Begins April 25, 2016**

*Project from N. 60<sup>th</sup> St. to W. Lisbon Ave. expected to be completed by October 2016, weather permitting*

Beginning Monday, April 25, the City of Milwaukee Department of Public Works (DPW) will reconstruct West Lloyd Street from North 60<sup>th</sup> Street to W. Lisbon Avenue. Site preparation work began today with full reconstruction beginning on Monday. The project completion date is expected to be October 2016.

The project includes:

- Replacing the existing pavement with new concrete pavement
- Replacing curbs, gutters, sidewalks, and driveway approaches
- Adding sidewalks to the south side of W. Lloyd Street from N. 46<sup>th</sup> St. to W. Lisbon Ave. adjacent to Washington Park
- Adding a five-foot bicycle lane in each direction.

The project will be accomplished in two stages to allow for through traffic on W. Lloyd St. during construction:

- **Stage 1:** One-way traffic will be maintained on the south side of the roadway in the eastbound lane between N. 47<sup>th</sup> and N. 60<sup>th</sup> streets. Two-way traffic will be maintained between N. 47<sup>th</sup> St. and W. Lisbon Ave.
- **Stage 2:** One-way traffic will be maintained on the north side of the roadway in the westbound lane from N. 47<sup>th</sup> to N. 60<sup>th</sup> streets. Two-way traffic will be maintained from N. 47<sup>th</sup> St. to W. Lisbon Ave.
- Some aspects of these stages may change due to other construction projects occurring in the area

On-street parking will not be available during construction. Businesses and agencies along the construction corridor will be open as usual. DPW's Support for Business program is providing signage throughout the area to help direct motorists and pedestrians to their destinations.

This project is managed by the City of Milwaukee Department of Public Works in conjunction with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation.
