



North 60th Street Resurfacing Project, West Florist Avenue to West Mill Road



Anticipated Start: July 11, 2016 and Anticipated Completion: October 31, 2016

Project Overview

This paving project will consist of placing a 3.5-inch asphalt overlay on the existing concrete pavement. Spot base patching, curb & gutter, sidewalk, and driveway approach replacements will be completed as necessary. The separate right turn lane at West Douglas Avenue will be removed.

Federal and local funds will be used to finance the construction costs.

Traffic

The paving project will be done in three stages to allow for through traffic on North 60th Street during construction:

Stage 1:

Traffic will be maintained in the existing inside lanes (next to the median) in each direction, while the work is occurring in the outside lanes and parking lanes


Stage 2:

Traffic will be maintained in the newly-paved parking lanes in each direction while work is occurring in the inside lanes and medians.

Stage 3:

Traffic will be maintained in either the inside or outside lanes in each direction while the surface layer of asphalt and pavement marking is placed.

Minor construction operations on the side streets will be handled with signing and flaggers.



Parking, Pedestrian and Driveway Access

On-street parking will not be available during construction. Provisions will be made to ensure that pedestrian access will be maintained to abutting properties and businesses during construction with the least amount of inconvenience. City staff and the contractor will work to minimize the amount of time any driveway access is restricted, and will notify the property owner 48 hours in advance of any driveway work.

Working Hours

Work is allowed from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday. The contractor cannot work outside those hours without prior approval from the Department of Public Works.

Bus Routes/Detour

The #76 Route: N. 60th – N. 70th will maintain operations during construction. Milwaukee County Transit will install temporary bus stop signs as necessary. Milwaukee County Transit will also be relocating the bus shelter at West Douglas Avenue as part of this project.

Communication and Contact Information

The City of Milwaukee will have staff overseeing various portions of the work:

- Project Engineer: Will be on-site full time to oversee the contractor's work and ensure that the concerns of the public and businesses are being addressed.
- Construction Supervisor: Will address contractor concerns
- The Support for Business Liaison (SBL): Will provide information about the construction project, share timelines and procedures via construction updates with businesses and other key organizations. The SBL also coordinates with the construction supervisor and project inspector to resolve concerns raised by businesses and residents.
