

Project Update

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The West Highland Boulevard construction project – North 12th to North 27th streets – began on April 3rd. Phase 1 of the project has been completed and Phase 2 began on July 3rd. During Phase 1, the outside lanes were under construction while traffic was maintained using the inside lanes. Driveways, sidewalks and gutters were replaced where necessary. Sewers and manhole structure replacement began and will continue through Phase 2. The work will occur in or adjacent to the inside lanes, while traffic travels in the outside lanes.

Wage Board. According to state and federal, all wages must be posted on the project site. This project's wage board is located on North 23rd Street and West Highland Boulevard.



Prep work for the installation of bioswales on the boulevards has begun. Mast arms for improved traffic signals have been placed on street corners throughout the project.

Support for Business worked with Alderman Bauman's office, the Department of Public Works Traffic Engineering section, and the Transportation Coordinator for the Wisconsin Conservatory of Life-Long Learning School (WCLL) to devise a plan to provide a safe school bus drop off for students. The area previously utilized was under construction.

This project is funded and managed by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation in conjunction with the City of Milwaukee Department of Public Works.
