

# Milwaukee Fire Department

Between January 1, 2013 and June 30, 2013, the Milwaukee Police Department (MPD) reported a 5.05% increase in violent crime and a 11.87% decrease in property crime compared to the first six months of 2012. Total crime experienced a 8.21% decrease during the first half of 2013, compared to the first half of 2012.

2013 Mid-Year Brochure

Between January 1, 2013 and June 30, 2013, the Milwaukee Fire Department (MFD) reported two fire fatalities and eleven civilian fire injuries. During this same time period, MFD made 1,540 fire responses, 4,246 rescue responses, and 574 service responses.

During the first six months of 2013, MFD responded to 14,008 ALS (Advanced Life Support) calls and 15,441 BLS (Basic Life Support) calls. MFD personnel made contact with 246,985 individuals regarding fire safety and distributed 779 smoke detectors to households that did not have a working smoke detector.



## Complaint Status



- Of the 120 complaints filed thus far in 2013, 11 formal complaints were open and remained under investigation, while 35 formal complaints were closed. All 74 informal complaints were closed.
- The most common complaint allegations included department procedures and department services; while the least common complaint allegations included disparate treatment and use of force.
- Police District 7, with 16 formal complaints and 21 informal complaints, was the district with the most complaints. Seven complaints contained no district location.

## FPC 2013 Mid-Year Brochure

- Between January 1, 2013 and June 30, 2013, 74 informal complaints and 46 formal complaints were filed with the FPC. In comparison, during the first six months of 2012, 82 informal complaints and 58 formal complaints were filed. This corresponds to a 10% decrease in informal complaints, a 21% decrease in formal complaints, and a 14% decrease in overall citizen complaints filed with the FPC.

- A total of 163 employees of the Milwaukee Police Department had complaints filed against them. Of these 83% were male and 17% were female.
- March and April, each with 24 total complaints, and June with 22 complaints, were the months with the most complaints filed. January and February were the months with the fewest complaints filed, 15 and 17 respectively.
- 54 complainants were female (50.5%), while 53 complainants were male (49.5%). 24 complainants failed to indicate gender.
