

# Election Worker Self-Screening

In order to keep everyone safe at the polling sites, it is important that each poll worker complete this survey prior to reporting to their precinct on voting days.

**1) To the best of your knowledge, have you or any members of your household been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19 in the last 14 days? Y N (close contact means):**

- within 6 feet of someone who has COVID-19 for at least 15 minutes
- providing care at home to someone who is sick with COVID-19
- direct physical contact with the person (touched, hugged, or kissed them)
- sharing eating or drinking utensils
- getting sneezed at, coughed on, or otherwise getting exposed to respiratory droplets

**2) Do you or any members of your household have any of the following symptoms, or did they have any of these symptoms in the last ten days? Y N**

- Fever – (defined as greater than or equal to 100 degrees)
- Chills
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Cough
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If the answer to either of these questions is **YES**, than PLEASE contact your Chief Inspector and the Election Commission to let them know **YOU WILL NOT BE REPORTING** to your voting site.

If you have been exposed to someone COVID positive, stay home for fourteen days after your last day of contact, monitor yourself closely for symptoms, and stay away from others as possible, especially those at increased risk of severe illness from COVID.

If you have or develop symptoms of COVID, call your healthcare provider and stay in contact with them. Stay home, avoid others as much as possible and stay rested and hydrated.
