

OPIOID OVERDOSE: HOW TO SAVE A LIFE

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS AN OPIOID OVERDOSE:

- Unconscious / non-responsive
- Slowed, shallowed or stopped breathing.
- Snoring or gurgling sounds

WHAT TO DO IF THERE ARE SIGNS OF AN OVERDOSE:

- Shake, tap or shout at the person to get a response
- Keep them awake if they respond
- Call 911 and place in overdose recovery position

IF YOU THINK SOMEONE IS OVERDOSING, DON'T WAIT! CALL 911!

OVERDOSE RECOVERY POSITION

1. Turn to one side, place hand against chin




2. Tilt head back, lift chin to open airway



3. Bend upper knee against the floor



4. Tilt head back, check breathing. Wait until emergency help arrives.



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
