Battalion 10 companies participated in company training, fire drills in schools and businesses, building inspections, and pre-fire planning for low-frequency high-risk incidents to include high-rise and shipboard fires to keep their skill levels current.

Battalion 10 and its companies are committed to providing excellent fire, medical, rescue, and prevention services to its citizens and visitors 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

On Mother's Day, May 11, Battalion 10 companies responded to the Highland Court Apartments, 2725 West Highland Boulevard. This three-story non-sprinklered 85-unit apartment building had a significant fire on the second floor which resulted in a 5th alarm assignment. There were 5 fire fatalities, 70+ residents rescued via aerial ladders, ground ladders, and interior stairwells, and well over 100 people displaced from this fire.

In August, Battalion 10 companies, along with every aspect of the MFD were inundated with calls for service during a historic "100-year" rainstorm which dumped up to 14" of rain on Milwaukee. During this time, companies also fought a 2nd alarm fire on the roof of a vacant 10-story cold storage warehouse at South Water & East Florida Streets.
