

## ***2025 TACTICAL EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES***

- Responded to 22 exigent requests from the Milwaukee Police Department to ensure both civilian and Milwaukee Police had immediate access to advanced life support during high-risk tactical events. These requests included high-risk warrant service, and more dynamic events such as hostage and standoff incidents, active shooter incidents, and other critical situations in which there is an increased risk of traumatic injury.
- Continued to facilitate training with the Milwaukee Police Department Tactical Enforcement Unit (TEU) at their scheduled Advanced Tactical Training monthly trainings. The collaborative training was performed in order for both teams to successfully work together and complete their missions.
- Facilitated interagency trainings included:
  - *Self-medical intervention training until care can be transferred to TEMS* was provided to the Milwaukee Police Department TEU, along with other TEU operators.
  - The Office of Emergency Management (OEM) and the Milwaukee County EMS Assistant Medical Director, Dr. Thomas Engel provided instruction to include topics on the history and practice of tactical/field trauma medicine and advanced emergency procedures. TEMS utilized OEM and Dr. Engel for the newest processes that are applicable to tactical medicine.
- Delivered an Active Shooter Presentation to the MFD recruit class and facilitated mock Rescue Task Force scenarios at the Milwaukee Safety Academy. The course also included hands-on rapid trauma assessment and interventions. This training provided the recruits with the knowledge and tactics to perform in an active shooter/ mass casualty incident.
- Delivered an Active Shooter Presentation to the Junior Fire Institute. The course included hands-on rapid trauma assessment, interventions and scenarios.
- Sent 13 members to Hyde Syte Tactics for a course entitled, “***Fire Department TEMS, Beyond the Warm Zone.***” This course goes beyond tactical emergency casualty care/TEMS and introduces fire personnel into the semi-permissive high threat environment. This course was taught by both fire and law enforcement professionals who provided insight and scenarios regarding active shooters, equipment familiarization and tactical skills to protect the operator and patients on scene. The class focused on in-depth instruction on administering trauma care to save lives, also dealing with moving to a safer place, weapons familiarization, and potentially mitigating threats.
- Added and trained six new members to the TEMS Team.
