

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 1987




1. The Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) became operational on August 19, 1987. Approximately 200,000 fingerprint cards were programmed into the system leading to 231 cold latent prints being identified by the end of the year.
2. On February 9, 1987, Memorandum 87-10 created the Department Newsletter, a monthly publication from the Office of the Chief of Police, which has opened an informal channel to the rank and file.
3. On January 30, 1987, a new policy was instituted regarding the handling of non-reportable vehicular accidents. The policy of not filing reports on non-reportable accidents has reduced the number of reports filed by 19%.
4. In 1987, the Milwaukee Police Department was proclaimed the Best Dressed Municipal Agency with over 200 officers by the National Association of Uniform Manufacturers and Distributors.
5. On September 1, 1987, a new Sixth District Station was officially opened at 3006 S. 27th Street.
6. A comprehensive policy was adopted relating to the handling of cases where members were exposed to communicable diseases.
7. A comprehensive High Speed Pursuit policy was amended to conform with State Statutes.
8. In cooperation with the Fire Department, Emergency Government, Airport Operations, and numerous line and staff personnel, the Major Occurrence Response Manual was updated.
9. On February 24, 1987, a Sexual Harassment policy was adopted to provide a work atmosphere free of actual or perceived sexual harassment.


"AUTOMATED FINGERPRINT IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM" (AFIS)










1987 PROPERTY

PREVIOUS YEARS COMPARISON




ARSON TOTALS FOR 1987




MILWAUKEE POLICE DEPARTMENT COMPARATIVE POLICE PERSONNEL DATA




1987 FISCAL OPERATIONS


