

HEPA VAC RENTAL SIGN OFF SHEET
DOs AND DON'Ts

Please review and sign this guide to familiarize yourself with the dos and don'ts of using HEPA vacuums.

Vacuum should be used for lead dust and paint chips ONLY

DOs for Using HEPA Vacuums to Remove Lead Dust

DO: Use a certified 3rd party HEPA vacuum. Ensure the vacuum is equipped with a true HEPA filter rated to capture 99.97% of particles as small as 0.3 microns.

DO: Vacuum all horizontal (flat) surfaces. Focus on floors, windowsills, baseboards, and furniture tops.

DO: Vacuum slowly and methodically. Move in one direction, then repeat in the opposite direction to ensure thorough coverage.

DO: Follow with wet cleaning. After vacuuming, use disposable cloths or mops with all-purpose cleaner to remove any remaining dust.

DO: Consider wearing protective gear. Use gloves, a mask, and/or old clothing that can be discarded after cleaning.

DO: Make sure all items are checked in and out when returning the vacuum.

DON'Ts for Using HEPA Vacuums to Remove Lead Dust

DON'T: use non-HEPA vacuums. Bagless or standard vacuums can release lead dust back into the air.

DON'T: clean while children or pregnant individuals are present. Lead exposure is especially harmful to these groups.

DON'T: use vacuum to suck up dirt, leaves or debris. Only use for fine dust.

DON'T: Dry sweep or shake rugs - this spreads lead dust into the air and onto clean surfaces.

DON'T: open vacuum. Please return full, and MHD will empty and clean out the bag properly.

DON'T: use vacuum for mold and asbestos removal.
