Expanding Naloxone Access Across Milwaukee

Free naloxone now available at more local businesses

Naloxone is a lifesaving medication that can reverse an opioid overdose. The City of Milwaukee Health Department (MHD) is making it easier to access by placing free naloxone displays in businesses throughout Milwaukee.

Each countertop display includes free naloxone and bilingual information in English and Spanish.
