**Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)
August 2020**



1. What is the proposed improvement?

The proposed improvement for the West Calumet Road Bridge project consists of removing the existing substructure and superstructure, then replacing it with a system of four box culverts.

The system of four box culverts will combine for a total length of 46 feet and width of 50 feet. The roadway will provide two 12-foot driving lanes and an eight foot shoulder (five feet paved and three feet unpaved).

2. Why does the bridge need replacement?

The existing bridge was constructed in 1937 and had its superstructure replaced in 1988. The deficiencies in this structure have advanced too far to warrant another rehabilitation.

3. How many vehicles use this roadway?

This roadway is a local road that provides a crossing over the Little Menomonee River just west of North 91ST Street. Around 1,700 vehicles travel over this roadway per day.

4. When will construction take place?

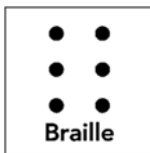
The construction is tentatively scheduled to take place in 2022. The construction season starts in spring and ends in fall.

5. Will the roadway be open to traffic during construction?

During construction, West Calumet Road will be closed to through traffic between N. 91st Street and W. Everts Street.

6. What is the cost of this improvement?

Estimated cost of the project is \$1,437,500. Federal aid will pay for 80% of the cost. The City will pay for the remaining 20%. No assessments are currently anticipated as part of this project.



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
