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THE FIRE AND POLICE COMMISSION TO HOLD TWO VIRTUAL COMMUNITY MEETINGS FOR CHIEF OF POLICE CANDIDATES ON SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 7 AND SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 21

The Board of Commissioners of the Fire & Police Commission (FPC) have narrowed down their search to three candidates for the next Chief of Police for the Milwaukee Police Department. The next step in the selection process includes hosting two community meetings; these will be held on Saturday, November 7 and Saturday, November 21, both days from 1:00 to 4:00 pm.

The Board of Commissioners announced the top six candidates on October 1, the majority of the Board of Commissioners interviewed the six candidates on October 19 and the top three candidates were announced on October 22.

The community meetings will be held virtually to abide by the health orders due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Community members that register will have the opportunity to make comments and ask questions directly of all three candidates. Following each meeting, participants will be sent a survey to gather information on which candidate they believe should be the next Chief of Police.

Community members can also submit questions or comments through the FPC's Public Comment Form. All questions and comments will be compiled and categorized, and used during each community meeting.

Both meetings will be held through GoToWebinar and streamed on Live Stream 2 by the City Channel.
