Business Group Offers \$1,000 Reward For Info Leading To Jasmine's Killer

A Milwaukee business group is offering a \$1,000 reward for information leading to the arrest of the person who shot and killed four-year-old Jasmine Owens on Monday night, Ald. Mike McGee, Jr. said.

The Small Business Association of Wisconsin – comprised of 6th Aldermanic District business owners – has stepped forward to help bring Jasmine's killer to justice, said Ald. McGee, who last month helped put up a \$1,000 reward for the hit-and-run driver responsible for the death of Melissa Bavier, 12, who was killed April 19 crossing the street near N. 16th and W. Locust St. A Milwaukee man has been arrested in that case.

Jack Adel of Mother's Foods at 16th and Locust – one of the key contributors to the reward fund to find the driver in the Melissa Bavier case – is heading the business group that is offering the reward to find Jasmine's killer, Ald. McGee said.

"Whoever did this must turn themselves in," the alderman said. "Also, the 26-year-old intended target of the drive-by needs to be a man and take responsibility for what happened, and that means helping track down the killer."

Witnesses have said the shooters were riding in a dark SUV in the 2800 block of N. 29th St. Monday night and that at least two of the occupants opened fire, with bullets hitting Jasmine in the head and the 26-year-old in the leg.
