Milwaukee Residents Can Sign Up To Get Emails On License Applications

Residents of the City of Milwaukee can now sign up to receive electronic notification of any licensing applications in their area, thanks to a new initiative by the City of Milwaukee Common Council and Office of the City Clerk.

By simply registering a valid email address and password at the City of Milwaukee's "E-Notify" link, users can be notified whenever a license application is made 600, 1,000 or 2,640 feet from the registered address. Users will be notified via email one day after any application within the designated parameters is submitted.

Ald. James N. Witkowiak, chair of the Common Council's Licenses Committee, and Rebecca Barron, manager of the License Division, implemented the new system to provide timely notification of licensing applications to nearby residents.

"This will be a valuable service for our constituents, throughout the city, many of whom have had to rely on cumbersome phone calls and paperwork to stay informed," said Ald. Witkowiak, who represents the 12th Aldermanic District. "People are more concerned than ever before about changes proposed in their neighborhoods, and this will be an excellent tool for them to receive timely information."

Common Council President Willie L. Hines, Jr. said city residents are better informed and can make better decisions about their neighborhoods when information is proactively supplied by the city. "I commend the Licenses Committee and the License Division for making this information more accessible," Ald. Hines said.
